For some, mid November and into December was a flurry of activity, and at a couple of points I was asked by someone if everything that happens is supposed to teach us something. I am not sure that we can answer that question "cosmically", but it seems to me that God CAN teach us something through most anything that happens. But, I am not sure everything happens - SO THAT - God can teach us something.

Over the years I have come to understand about "holding things loosely".

I know that I can keep a pretty firm hold on the things that matter to me, and when there are unfilled expectations, or things that get canceled, or when people go their own way and do their own thing, we experience grief and / or disappointment.

It is during these times that I have noticed how God CAN and DOES continue to speak to me creating space to receive something new. In this space, God helps me hold loosely to those things in my life where I might need to loosen my grip. As we hold our expectations loosely, we might discover that even if things don't go as planned, the unexpected can bring a new joy, and sometimes a necessary and life giving shift.

Heading into 2024, I think about Mary and Elizabeth, Joseph, shepherds, the magi, even the Innkeeper, and everyone who had to let go of their grip on ancient expectations in order to receive something brand new. Something unexpected, the infant Messiah.

## Epiphany Season

(St. Jude League)

Epiphany (or Theophany, as it is known in the Eastern Rite Catholic Church), also known as Three Kings'


Day, is a Christian feast day that celebrates the revelation of God in His Son as human in Jesus Christ. The word epiphany comes from the Greek word meaning "manifestation." The feast also commemorates the visit of the Magi to the Christ child, and thus Jesus' physical manifestation to the Gentiles.

Typically celebrated on January 6, or the closest Sunday to that date, the feast of Epiphany allows us to truly comprehend what it means that God has brought His only Son into our world. The Wise Men - Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar - were the first people outside of the stable to come and pay homage to Jesus. These unlikely royal visitors showered Jesus with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, herbs typically used for burial, possibly foreshadowing Jesus' destiny.

The Magi were taking a huge risk in following the star to Bethlehem, but they trusted that God was leading them to something far greater than they could know. This is such a powerful example of how we as Christians should live our lives. Trusting that God knows what is best for us and that His plan, no matter how unattainable things might seem on the journey, will lead us to where we need to be. We should also have the strength to see Jesus in our lives in unexpected ways, and when we do, worship and adore Him.

As the Epiphany star lights our way, you and I are reminded of God's guiding, renewing, steadfast, and surprising presence in our world. May we challenge ourselves to ease up on our grip and relax into the mystery of our faith and trust that God continues to speak and guide us in mind, body and spirit.

# Fruit Pizza

(submitted by Patsy Schuh in blue church cookbook)

First layer:  $1\frac{1}{2}$  c. flour  $\frac{1}{2}$  c. powdered sugar  $\frac{3}{4}$  c. butter Second layer: 8 oz. cream cheese  $\frac{1}{2}$  c. sugar 1 tsp. vanilla

Third layer: Assorted fruit

Fourth layer: 2 T. cornstarch 1 c. fruit juice (apple works)

 $\frac{1}{2}$  c. sugar 2 tsp. lemon juice

Mix ingredients for the first layer. Spread on a greased pizza pan or cookie sheet. Bake for 10 minutes or until golden brown at 350 degrees.

Mix ingredients for the second layer. Spread over the cooled crust.

For the third layer, cut up the desired fruit and place on the frosting layer.

Mix ingredients for the fourth layer in a small saucepan and heat to boiling stirring occasionally. Cool and spread over fruit.



1 bag frozen broccoli, carrots & cauliflower combination, thawed and drained.




1 c. shredded Swiss cheese
